Donna Mingerick, MS, CSP, Occupational Safety Consultant with Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center chaired a discussion on Slips, Trips and Fall Prevention at the August chapter meeting. One of the goals of the meeting was to inform the ASSE's members of the severity of slips, trips and falls. Attendees were also given tools practical tips and techniques to recognize and reduce the risk of slips, trips and falls in the work place and at their homes.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, slips, trips and falls accounted for 219,630 OSHA recordable injuries or nearly 8%. Slips, trips and falls resulted in 704 deaths.
